Wyoming's Presidential Electors Vote

CHEYENNE, WY – Today Wyoming's three presidential electors met in the office of the Secretary of State with Governor Matt Mead and Secretary of State Ed Murray. The electors each cast their vote for Donald Trump for the Office of U.S. President and Michael Pence for U.S. Vice President.

The ballots cast by Wyoming's electors were canvassed by the State Election Director Kai Schon who then reported the results to Governor Mead, Secretary Murray, the electors, and assembled members of the media and the public. Each elector then signed six original "Certificates of Vote," which were certified by Secretary Murray as he affixed the Great Seal of the State of Wyoming on each certificate.

"Wyoming's three presidential electors closed out this historic election today and cast their votes as provided for through the Electoral College process," said Secretary Murray. "As of today the sacred and final step has been taken for our Nation, and Wyoming's part in the Presidential election is now complete. I would like to thank the Wyoming electorate for participating and for delivering a record voter turnout."

One certificate will be sent to the President of the U.S. Senate, Joe Biden; one will be sent to the Chief Judge of Wyoming's Federal District Court, Judge Nancy Freudenthal; two will be sent the United States National Archivist, David S. Ferriero; and two will be retained by the Secretary of State.

Wyoming's 2016 Presidential Electors are Karl Allred of Evanston, Bonnie Foster of Casper, and Teresa Richards of Rock Springs.

Congress will meet in a joint session to conduct the official tally of Electoral College votes on January 6, 2017. 270 Electoral College votes are required to elect the President of the United States.
